Douglas Emmett Obtains \$400 Million Term Loan Fixed at 2.64%

SANTA MONICA, Calif., Oct. 13, 2015 /PRNewswire/ -- Douglas Emmett, Inc. (NYSE:DEI), a real estate investment trust (REIT), announced that it has closed a secured, non-recourse \$400 million interest only loan that will mature in November 2022. The loan bears interest at a floating rate of Libor plus 1.35% which has been fixed at 2.64% per annum until November 2020 through an interest rate swap. The new loan is secured by a pool of seven of Douglas Emmett's office properties.

Douglas Emmett is using approximately \$254 million of the proceeds to pay down the outstanding balance of its existing \$510 million loan due April 2, 2018.
